




ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Saheed Anurup Chandra Mahavidyalaya, which started its journey on 16th November, 1991, as a Government Aided Co-educational Degree College affiliated to the University of Calcutta, is a renowned institution of higher education in southern West Bengal, especially in the district of South 24 Parganas. The college located in the rural hinterland of the state capital, has evolved as a seat of academic excellence and has made significant developments in the fields of sports and physical education, socio-cultural activities and NSS programmes over the past three decades. The college has been christened after Saheed Anurup Chandra Sen, a great Indian freedom fighter associated with the revolutionary uprising in Bengal, famously known as the Chittagong Armoury Raid. Anurup Chandra Sen was a distinguished member of the Chittagong Youth Revolutionary Party along with great revolutionaries like Masterda Surya Sen and many other stalwarts. Saheed Anurup Chandra Mahavidyalaya is a tribute to Shri Anurup Chandra Sen, who eventually, took shelter in the Burul village of South 24 Parganas, and joined the Burul High School as a teacher, after the uprising. As a keen educationist he inspired a group of young students from this village to pursue education zealously and sincerely, and also indoctrinated in them the values of social and moral responsibilities towards the country and its citizens. Unfortunately, only after four years of his stay in Burul, Anurup Chandra Sen was arrested by the British police after a tip-off from a local informer. Later, Sri Sen died in jail while fasting in protest. In his brief teaching career, Anurup Chandra Sen ignited the dream of upliftment and emancipation among the marginalised and underprivileged students of this rural hamlet through the path of knowledge and education.

Late Sri Pravash Roy, one of his students and his ardent disciple, took the pioneering initiative to materialize the vision of his teacher in enabling the socially and economically deprived students (both boys and girls) of the adjoining areas to pursue higher education. The founding members of this institution recognised the inconveniences faced by the learners of the remote rural areas in receiving college-education. They dreamt of dispelling their distress through the establishment of a degree college in the Burul village itself. Their vision was shared by the local community, whose unstinted help and support extended from procuring the land for the college to its final establishment in the year 1991. Today, Saheed Anurup Chandra Mahavidyalaya, is a renowned co-educational institution of the district of South 24 Parganas, imparting higher education to more than 1500 students cutting across economic, social, religious and cultural boundaries. The college upholds the ideals of its founding members - to achieve excellence in higher education, of empowerment through knowledge, of inclusive growth for socio-economic upliftment of its students and of sustainable development of the society at large, through hard work and sincere efforts by all the stakeholders of this 30-year-old institution.

VISION

By default, the College is predominantly focussed to provide education to the learners of the economically and socially backward community and to dispel the distresses of the learners of the remote villages of outstretching areas in receiving college-education.

IQAC

For the purpose of monitoring and providing proper governance, this college have 22 sub-committees, 5 cells and 3 clubs, where each sub-committee and club has its own responsibilities under responsible members, both teaching and non-teaching staff, of this college. The IQAC shall have the following composition: (a) Principal - Chairperson (b) Five senior teachers and one senior administrative official - Member (c) Two external experts on Quality Management/ Industry/Local Community - Member (d) Director / Coordinator – Member Secretary. The members at (b) and (c) of the above shall be nominated by the Principal of the College in consultation with the academic body of the College (Academic Committee of a College).

INFRASTRUCTURE & FACILITIES OF COLLEGE CAMPUS

LAND AND BUILDING:

The campus area of the college is **8700.749 square metres**. Total built-up area (including the Guard's room, cheap stores, common room, generator room, cycle stand, canteen, students' union and women's hostel) of the college is **2831square metres**.

The college building comprises of the following blocks:

(i) **South Block** – It covers three floors, the details of which is as follows:

Ground Floor: Office of the Principal, Principal's Room, Teachers' room.

First Floor: NSS and Medical Room, Reprographic Counter, University Examination Work Room and Library.

Second Floor: One Class Room.

(ii) East Block – It covers three floors, the details of which is as follows:

Ground Floor: Computer Laboratory, Geography Laboratory, General Store Room, Physical Education Store Room, Five Smart Class rooms.

First Floor: Seminar Hall cum class Room (Smart class), IQAC Room, Commerce IT Lab cum

Class room, Two Smart Class Rooms, One Class Room, Library.

Second Floor: Two Smart Class Rooms and Three Class Rooms.

(iii) Other Buildings - Apart from the above mentioned two blocks, we have some other buildings to serve miscellaneous purposes such as Security Room, Boys' Common Room, Generator Room, Cycle Stand, Canteen, A three storied Women's Hostel, Students' Union Room and Gymnasium.

Class Rooms:

The college has well-furnished class rooms, with good ventilation. Sufficient numbers of lights and fans are installed in each room of the college. Presently the college has 16 (Sixteen) spacious class rooms with proper sitting arrangement of teacher and students. The big classrooms are well ventilated, with lots of sunlight, ideal for large classes. 10 (Ten) Classrooms (Room No. EB-01, EB-03, EB-05, EB-06, EB-07, EB-08, EB-14, EB-15, EB-24, SB-21) have facilities of smart class system (Overhead Ceiling-mounted Projector, Laptop, and Computers) and EB-11, EB-12, EB-13, EB-21, EB-22, EB-23 have audio facilities and 1(one) Classroom (Room No. EB-14) is Virtual-classroom with advanced audio-visuals multimedia facilities. Some departments have their own classrooms and there are some common classrooms.

Technology Enabled Learning Spaces: College has created One **Virtual Class Room** and Ten **Smart Classrooms** which is equipped with Computers, Overhead Projector, LED TV, Laptop, Internet Connection (through data card), Web-Camera for Video Conference and Audio-Visual Aids for creating environment for ICT enabled teaching-learning. It is extensively used by various departments for imparting teaching through Information-Communication-Technology. It is also used occasionally for holding important staff meetings. The rooms are also utilized to counsel the students during the University Registration of the first-year students.

Augmentation of Physical Infrastructure: RUSA 2.0:

The college has received a handsome grant from **Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan** (RUSA 2.0) a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS). A good number of instruments for upgradation of infrastructure i.e., enriched laboratory equipment, modern amenities, and books for the library have been procured from RUSA grant. The RUSA grant has been utilized for- new constructions, renovation and procurement of equipment. Since last three sessions various types of developmental work in different categories, mentioned above, have been completed. Modern amenities like AC Machines, Green Generator, Equipment for Smart Class Rooms, Digital Podiums, Computers, Laptop, Lawn Mower, ICT equipment, EPBAX, Aquaguard and Sanitary Napkins Vending Machines, etc. are also purchased. 7 classrooms have been upgraded into the smart classrooms. Library infrastructural development have been undertaken. A two storied building for the purpose of Boy's Common Room and IQAC Room was constructed by PWD with the help of RUSA 2.0 Fund. The college has also installed CCTV cameras at different places of the college campus for security and surveillance. Presently, new staff and student's toilets are being constructed by PWD with the RUSA grant.

Playground:

The college has two playgrounds of size, approximately 1000 Sq. metre, and one volleyball court which are used for the practical classes of Physical Education throughout the year. Other events such as College Sports Meet, miscellaneous outdoor games, Annual Cultural Programmes etc. are also held here. Football goal posts and Kho-Kho posts have been put up in the campus playground for students' sports activities.

Outdoor Sports:

Huge playground is available for Cricket, Football, Volleyball, Badminton, Kho-Kho, Athletics etc. Annual sports meet is organized every year. Our college students (both Male & Female Team) actively participate in Kho-Kho Meet, Athletics Meet & other sports events at other college/university levels. Exceptionally talented players participate at the University level and this year (2022) the college male Kho- Kho team has won the Inter-College Calcutta University Championship.

Indoor Games:

Carrom, Chess, Table Tennis etc. are available in Students' Common Rooms for the students to practice whenever they are free.

Students' Common Room:

The college has one Boys' and one Girls' Common room.

Computer Education:

The college has a well-equipped computer training centre to provide advanced computer education (Office management and DTP) to all students of the college for two years. There are 28 computers in the computer laboratory. This course is compulsory for all students of Semester-1 to 4.

Gymnasium:

The college has a well-equipped Gymnasium for conducting the practical classes of Physical Education. Students from other departments can also avail the gym facilities, subject to the rules and regulations of using the gymnasium.

Women's Hostel:

A women's hostel has been constructed and completed from UGC Grant (10th Plan) in January, 2013. It is a three storied building. There have total 6 rooms in this hostel.

Library:

The college has a central library occupying 196.68 sq m. It provides Reading Room facilities and borrowing facilities to the students and to the teaching and non-teaching staff. The library has a collection of large number of books at the disposal of undergraduate students of various disciplines. It has nearly 21864 books which includes both text books and other reference books and 4 journals. Daily newspapers are also available in the library.

A career corner has been set up for fulfilling the demands of job-related news among students. Different publications like Employment News, Karmakshetra, Karmasangsthan are available here for aspiring students. The college library is yet to subscribe for e-resources. Complete Accession Numbering System and Cataloguing of all books and journals and user-friendly Multi-Digit Alpha Numeric Decimal based numbering system according to the 19th edition of Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme are followed in the library.

SOUL software has been procured for automating in-house activities and services of the library. ONE computer for Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is available for the students to identify the status of availability of books in the library and THREE computer terminals are available for Internet Surfing. Bibliographic Service facility and Career Advancement News Service facility is also available.

Laboratory: There are well-equipped laboratories in the departments of **Geography, Physical Education, Commerce and Computer Science**, which are used by the students for the practical classes under the guidance of professors. The college has bought many equipment for the laboratories of the Department of Geography and the Department of Physical Education in last year from RUSA Fund.

Seminar/Conference Room:

The college has a seminar room of size 1,800 sq. feet with a sitting capacity of 200 students. Major events such as UGC-sponsored State Level Seminars, Freshers' Welcome, Annual Cultural Competition, Departmental Seminars, Youth Parliament etc. are conducted here. University Examinations and College Examinations are also held in this hall.

Canteen:

The college has a spacious canteen within the college campus. Recently it has been renovated and separate arrangements have been made for the students and for the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college.

Achievements and Programmes of NSS Unit:

The NSS Unit of the college started its journey in the academic session 2007-08. Since then, it is motivating the students to pursue extension activities in different categories like community development, social work, health and hygiene awareness, health camp, adult and literacy, education blood donation environment awareness, AIDS Awareness camp etc. Every year, 100 students are enrolled as a member of our college NSS Unit. Some prestigious national-level achievement awards have been won by our NSS unit in the last few years. Some of the examples are highlighted here. This college achieved the best NSS College unit in the University of Calcutta in 2009-10 and 2012-13, the Best Programme Officer of The NSS Unit and The Best Volunteer of the University of Calcutta in 2010-11.

NSS unit of the college arranges 3 programmes every year. Among them two programmes (Regular Programme and Red Ribbon Camp Programme) are held in the college premises and one Special Camp is arranged in an adopted area, preferably in the neighbouring locality. In the Regular Programme this unit had arranged 'Swach Bharat Abhiyan' in 2016-17. Their work includes the college campus beautification and organisation of a Blood Donation Camp in collaboration with the student's union. The NSS unit also arranges special lecture cum workshop on blood related diseases like Thalassemia and HIV Aids and arranges free blood test programme as a part of the Red Ribbon Camp Programme. The Special Camps are arranged in the local area for making people aware of environmental pollution, for providing facilities like general eye and health check-ups and distribution of educational and sports equipment to the local students.

Cultural Activities: The College organizes several cultural programmes in which students display their talents. College Freshers' Welcome and College Social are held every year on our college ground. Students of the college publish wall magazines; annual magazine under the supervision of teachers. Students participate in departmental quiz competitions, debate competitions, etc. They also participate in Youth Parliament contests at the district level. College also has a Drama Club, Debate Club and Nature Club for developing cultural and environmental awareness among the college students. The college has arranged many cultural programmes like Student Week Celebration, International Mother Tongue Day, Women's Day, Annual Sports, Blood Donation Camp and International Environment Day in the last academic year. The college celebrated the Basanta Utsav for the first time this year with lot of grandeur.

Special Day Celebrations: The college celebrates special days by different departments. The International Language Day celebration was arranged by the language departments of Bengali and English with a cultural programme. The International Environment Day was celebrated by the Department of Geography and some trees were planted in the college premises on that occasion in this year. The World Yoga Day is celebrated by the department of Physical Education every-year.

Workshops and Seminar: The IQAC, Career Counselling Cell, Department of Enrichment Courses and different departments organize seminars, workshops and symposium for enrichment of staff and students. The Career Counselling Cell of the college has arranged 3 workshops for the student's career development in the past year.

Health and Hygiene: The College specially takes care of the health and hygiene of the students and staff. The college has a separate Medical Room with provisions of First Aid Box, sphygmomanometer, weighing machine and a medical bed. The college also organizes regular health check-up for students and staff members by registered medical practitioner.

Facilities for Medical Emergencies: For medical emergencies, staff and students are taken to Burul Primary Health Centre situated at about 0.5 km away from the college.

Yoga: At present, only the students of Physical Education Department are being imparted Yoga training classes. The college has a plan to introduce the Certificate Course of Yoga and Physiotherapy from the Academic Session 2022-23.

Public Address System: All classrooms and the office of the Principal are equipped with public address system. These are used to announce various information and the important notices for the benefit of the students.

Security: College is under 24×7 security surveillance. The college premises is watched over by 3 security guards. A Guard Room has been constructed near the gate for this purpose. The total college area is also under CCTV camera surveillance. A total of 32 cameras have been installed at different parts of the college for this purpose.

Drinking Water Facility: Safe and cool drinking water facility has been made available for all staff and students of the college The college has installed 2 industrial water purifiers near the student's canteen and college office. Four domestic water purifiers are also installed in the library and teacher's room, College Office and Canteen.

Generator: For uninterrupted power supply the college has installed two powerful (35 kVA and 40 kVA) generators for providing power back-up during power failure. College also has 10 inverters for temporary power back up during power failure.

Cycle stand, Car parking facility: College provides a space for car parking behind the south block of our college building. There is a specified area for a cycle stand in the college premises. A new cycle stand is currently under construction with the RUSA 2.0 grant.

Fire Hazard Safety: Fire extinguishers are placed in various locations like canteen, office, teachers' room, library, laboratories, smart class room and every floor of our college.

Students' Union:

Saheed Anurup Chandra Mahavidyalaya democratically elects Students' Union representatives as per directive of Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal.

Audit:

College Accounts are regularly audited by Government empanelled Auditors appointed by the Director of Public Instruction, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal.

Scholarships and Student's Concession:

Students of the college are assisted to access several scholarships and financial assistance schemes offered by the State Government. The major ones applied by students include **Swami Vivekananda Merit Cum Means Scholarship (SVMCM)**, **Kanyashree**, **SC/ST/OBC Scholarship**, **Minority Scholarship Student's Credit Card.** The college has dedicated Nodal Officers for each scholarship to assist students in the application process.

Students who are not eligible for the above-mentioned scholarships, are encouraged to apply for **Students Concession** provided by the college. The applications are scrutinized by the Student Concession Sub- Committee members. In the last academic session 63 students received Students Concession on recommendation of the Student Concession Sub- Committee.

Alumni:

The college is in the process of forming the alumni association for involving them in the process of development of the college.

A Parent-Teacher Meeting is held every year to discuss the student's progress with their guardian.

Examination:

The 3year B.A. /B.Sc. (Honours and General) & B. Com (General) Course under CBCS consists of Six (6) Semesters (Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V and Semester-VI). End Semester Examinations are to be held ordinarily at the end of the concerned Semester, i.e., Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-V examinations are held in December-January and Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-VI examinations are held in June-July.

All the Internal Assessments and Tutorial Examinations are held according to the Academic Calendar of the University of Calcutta.

Magazine:

The college publishes many wall magazines and e-magazines round the year. These serve as the

medium for expressing the students' literary talent and for voicing their opinion and propagation of discipline-based knowledge. Magazine 'ABHIZAN' is published from the Students' Union of the College every year. The first issue of 'COSMOS' an e-Magazine has been published in the last academic year from the Department of Geography. The Department of History has published an e-magazine and a wall magazine, 'Itihas Darpan' last year. 'DE-AAL-KAYDA' from the Department of Bengali, 'AURORA' from the Department of Geography, 'AAKOR' from the Department of History, 'FOCUS' from the Department of Political Science are other wall magazines published every year with the contribution of departmental students.

Excursions and Study Tours:

The college organizes study tours and excursions within the curriculum of different subjects (like History, Political Science etc.) with an aim to increase the interests of the students. Such academic excursions are mandatory for subjects like Geography and Physical Education.

Attendance:

A student once admitted must regularly attend all allotted classes. As per the New Regulations under CBCS (University Notifications No. CSR/3/18, dt. 07.05.2018) of the University of Calcutta, 10 marks, 8 marks and 6 marks will be given to a student on the basis of class attendance (90% and above, 75% and above but less than 90%, 60% and above but less than 75% respectively) in each semester. Students attending less than 60% of the allotted classes will not be eligible to appear for the end-semester examinations.

Academic Session:

The **Semester-II**, **Semester-III**, **Semester-V** commences from 1st July and ends on the 30th December (6 months). **Semester-II**, **Semester-IV**, **Semester-VI** commences from 1st January and ends on the 30th June (6 months).

Discipline:

Admission of a student in this college implies adherence to the prescribed code of conduct and observance of rules laid down by the college.

College Hours:

Normally, all classes of the college are held from 10 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. Monday to Friday and 10 A.M to 2 P.M on Saturdays. Classes are not held during, holidays, summer and winter recess, university examinations and non-instructional working days.

DEPARTMENT OF ENRICHMENT COURSES





Department of Enrichment Courses

The Department of Enrichment Courses was introduced in the session 2006-07 to provide training for job-oriented courses to the students, ex-students and students from the local community in order to help them find employment. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE STUDENTS

GENERAL RULES

Admission Forms are made available to the prospective students through the website www.sacm.ac.in just after the publication of the results of Higher Secondary Examination conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education. The admission process is conducted according to the merit of the applicants and strictly in compliance with the Guidelines/Govt. Orders/Circulars/Memos/Directives etc issued by The Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, the University of Calcutta and the University Grants Commission.

ADMISSION TO OTHER SEMESTERS AND PAYMENT OF FEES

- 1. The students must pay the Semester fees online before the commencement of each semester classes within the notified period.


